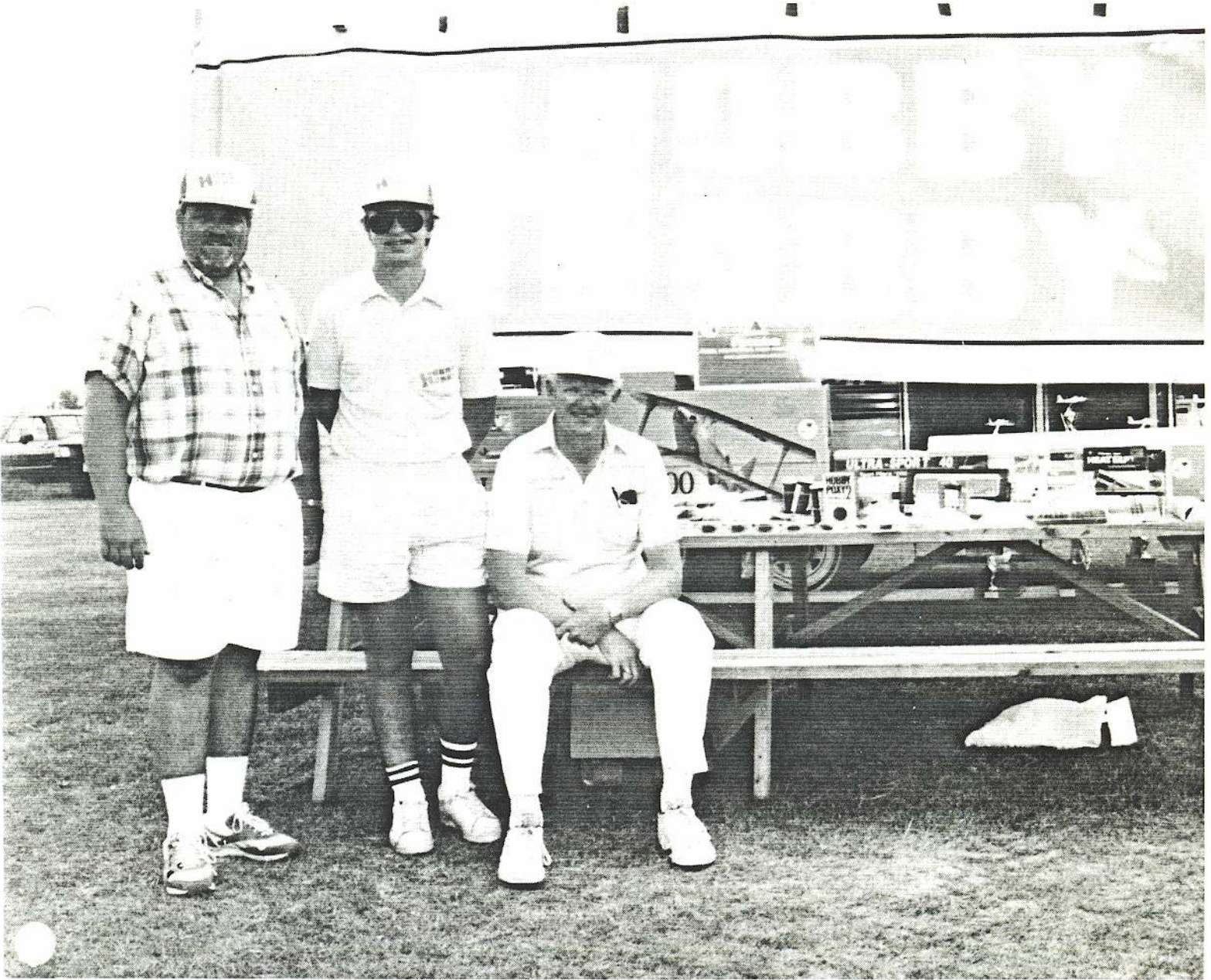

1990 O.M.F.C. Pattern Contest

The Oakville Model Flying Club held its annual Pattern Contest on July 28th and 29th 1990. This was the year that contest director Tony KREG decided to start early to promote the contest as well as providing a forum to enable first time, would be, pattern fliers the opportunity and encouragement to participate. Having Ivan KRISTENSEN as assistant contest director not only provided continuity and experience, but gave participants the opportunity to meet one of the worlds premier pattern fliers.

The success of any event requires promotion, organization and most importantly financial sponsorship. Hobby Hobby the regions largest and best hobby store group, owned by Tom BAKONYI, provided that sponsorship. It is this kind of support from Hobby Hobby that contributed to the success of the event. The weather man was on our side, providing us with two beautiful sunny days. The best of the season to that date. We had 45 entrants, the largest turn out on record. (7 Sportsman, 14 Intermediate, 10 Advanced, 9 Expert and 5 F.A.I. competitors) This was an increase of 11 participants over last years contest and this can be directly attributed to Hobby Hobby's involvement with the organization.

Prizes were provided for each class, down to third place. Beautiful full color 5X7 pictures were taken of each participant at the beginning of the contest. The prints were installed on plaques and given out as trophies. The remaining prints were distributed as consolation prizes to each and every competitor as a memento of the event. Hobby Hobby decided to surprise all the competitors and workers by providing a free lunch and beverage. This also added to the success of the event. We organized a raffle ticket draw for one of three groups of prizes with a total value of \$500.00. By limiting the number of tickets we created lots of excitement, keeping the odds of winning very high. The draw took place at the end of the contest with the winner being Paul SVEC of Scarborough. After the prizes for the first three places of each class were given out the rest of the prizes were distributed by drawing the names of all the competitors and workers out of a hat. In all HOBBY HOBBY donated gifts with a total value of \$2350.00

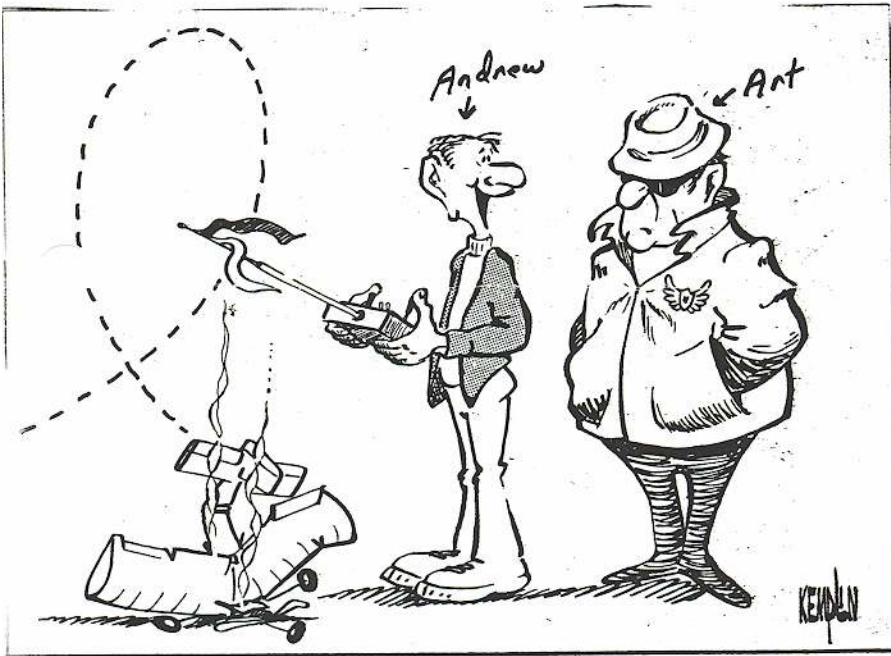
In F.A.I. the scores were normalized and the judges had to go to the 4th flight to break the tie between Greg and Colin.

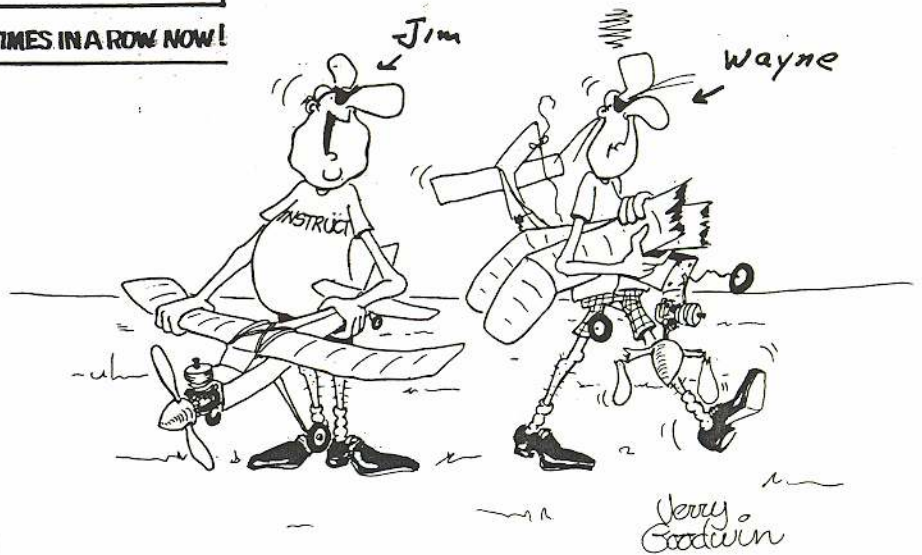
