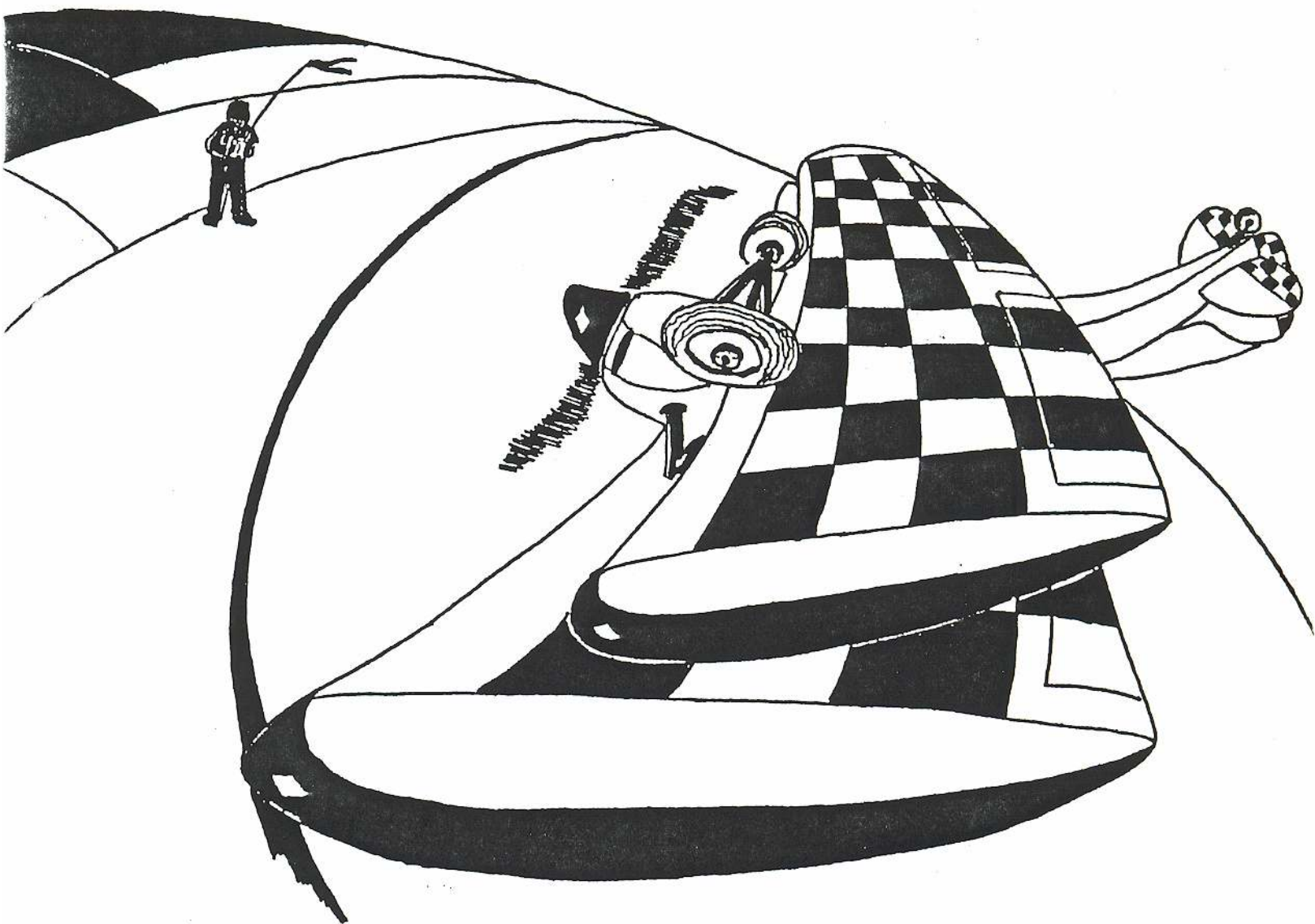

2. NOTE: Please specify on your OMFC application if you have your Wings from OMFC (that is, you have been checked out at THIS club by an OMFC instructor).
3. Renewals received by the Secretary/Treasurer not later than November 30th, and which include the MAAC renewal, will receive the crest offered by MAAC for early renewal.
4. Note that the MAAC dues already include the GST! Should a person refuse to pay the GST before January 1, 1991, they will be billed by MAAC later in 1991. Should the GST not pass, those people who have paid will be reimbursed by MAAC later in 1991.

Minutes of Meeting

The November Meeting of the Oakville Model Flying Club was brought to order by President Frank Lilliman on November 5th, 1990 in Knox Presbyterian Church Hall, at 8:00 PM sharp.

After new members and guests were recognized and welcomed, the minutes of the October meeting were adopted as published in the Fliteline.

A brief, unofficial update of the Club's financial status was given by Treasurer Walter Gray, following which Tony Kreglewski submitted his financial report for the Pattern Contest held during the summer.

As announced in the November Fliteline, a motion was made to delete reference to the DDC licence requirements from the OMFC By-Laws. This motion is in keeping with the DDC dropping its requirement for recreational R/C operators to hold a licence. Motion was made by John Gooch, seconded by Bruce Dealhoy, and carried. The appropriate changes will be incorporated into the Club By-Laws.

Following this, Art Blackburn, the Club's Chief Flying Instructor, presented this year's successful students with their certificates and wings. Also receiving certificates and a well deserved 'thanks' were the Club's Instructors. (See the section on 'Presentations' elsewhere in this issue. - a.s.). A special certificate and thanks were presented to Art as our CFI.

Jack McGregor has decided to 'take a sabbatical' from the hobby (hopefully not for long!). In appreciation for the many, many things Jack has done for the Club over the years he was presented with an honorary lifetime membership with O.M.F.C. (That way he can't quit the Club!!).

The November meeting is the Club's Annual General Meeting, at which the new slate of officers is elected for the coming year. The following officers were either elected by acclamation or are incumbents from 1990. This is the 1991 OMFC Executive:

In addition, Art Blackburn was re-appointed as Chief Flying Instructor.

Following the election of the 1991 Executive, a motion was made by Jack Swift, and seconded by Nick Rosenboom, to eliminate Club dues for members of the executive. During the ensuing discussion, John Bell moved that the motion be amended to state that the members of the executive receive an honorarium equal to the Club dues. (to avoid conflict with the membership stipulations in the Club By-Laws). The amendment was seconded by Dave Slote, and was carried. Therefore, Standing Resolution #14 will be added to the Club's Constitution, and read:

"Members of the OMFC Executive Committee will be yearly awarded an honorarium equal to the Club dues for that membership year."

During 'Show & Tell', Mark Groh presented his beautiful scratch-built high wing monoplane. The plane was Mark's first attempt at scratch building, and the the results were very impressive.

After a short coffee break, an attempt was made to fill the position of Social Director, but with no luck. Members were asked to consider before their involvement before the next meeting.

Don Field continued his discussion on 'How to Winterize your Aircraft and Equipment', with the emphasis this meeting on the electrical and radio components of the aircraft.

Before the meeting ended, there was a short discussion on the 1991 membership renewals, and how MAAC dues were affected by the GST. Art Blackburn suggested that the Treasurer obtain MAAC crests for those members who renewed their MAAC membership through OMFC before Nov. 30th.

The meeting ended with the President, Frank Lilliman, presenting the gavel to the President-Elect, Jim Eichenberg.

Cat's Cradle

Well, it's good to be back (I think). It's been five years since I've done this last - and everything is five years older, except for Don F. Membership in the Club is way up, and almost everyone I see at the meetings has come to the Club or the hobby in the last five years.

Last month I gave myself a treat and bought one of the Great Planes Ultra Sport 40 kits. That is one nice kit! I hope to bring it to the next meeting and tell you about it, but I'll say this now: if you need a suggestion to give for this Christmas, look no further!

Personally, it's been a very quiet season. I can count the number of flights I had on one finger! In the future I'll stick to planes that have their tails at the right end and their wings pointing in the normal direction. Which brings up a good point. If you are going to experiment, make sure your experiment is controlled. I had a forward swept-wing canard which was using a new engine and a prop style I had never used before. That's four new things on one plane! The way I see it, that's three more than you can control. Get into things gradually - once you prove out one point, then you can move on to experimenting with the next. One at a time. That way, if something goes wrong, it's fairly easy to isolate the problem (assuming there's anything left to isolate).

Constitutional Amendments

* The following amendments were made to the OMFC By-Laws and Standing Resolutions at the November Annual Meeting:

1. By-Laws Article 1.2(A), 'Requirements for Membership' has been amended to read:

2. Standing Resolution #14 'Executive Committee Honorarium' has been added as follows:
